Situated on the beautiful Beaulieu River, the 18th century shipbuilding village of Buckler's Hard is a stunning reconstructed village. There's lots to explore and see, from the ship builders' cottages all as they originally were, to the maritime museum showing the fascinating history of the Beaulieu River and its shipping background.

Once you've finished exploring there's the captain's tea room for light bites or the Master Builder's Hotel offering pub-style meals.
